

# Bobble



A necklace knitted all-in-one, from two strands of fine yarn.

A small amount of stuffing is needed, I used some wool fibre, which could also be felted for interesting effects, although I did not do that.

I used T3 standard gauge throughout. You could use thicker yarn and a different gauge. You could make a longer chain and forego the fastener.

## Knitting

Cast on 3 stitches. Hang a weight [ I used a metal peg]. Set to slip in one direction. Knit 50 rows.

\*\*Cancel slip setting.

Cast on 4 stitches at the carriage side for 4 rows [19 stitches]. I used e wrap, and made sure to bring the needles out to holding position on each row for several rows.

Knit 6 rows.

With a double transfer tool, at both ends, transfer the end two stitches to the next two needles, and then take these stitches off again, and transfer to the next two needles [ thus effectively casting off four stitches either end] [11 stitches] Knit 1 row

With the double transfer tool, at both ends, transfer the end two stitches to the next two needles [7 stitches] Knit 1 row

With the double transfer tool, at both ends, transfer the end two stitches to the next two needles [3 stitches] Knit 1 row

Set to slip in one direction. Knit 20 rows.\*\*

Repeat from \*\* to \*\* four times. Then knit a further 30 rows, and cast off, by drawing the end of the yarn through all three stitches.

## Finishing

Attach a fastener on either end of your chain.

Stitch each bead seam, and stuff the beads as you go.
