

Basic Square

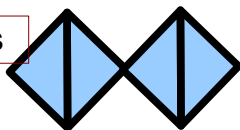
Cast on 25 sts.[or any odd number]

1st row: Slip 1, knit to last stitch, k1 through back of loop.

Decrease row: slip 1, k to centre 3 sts, slip 1, k2tog, psso, knit to last stitch, knit 1 through back of loop.

Repeat these rows till only 1 stitch remains, cast off.

Knit 2 [25 st] squares



Patchwork Bag

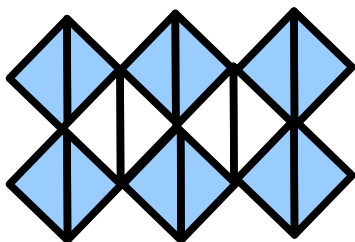

Knit 6 more squares

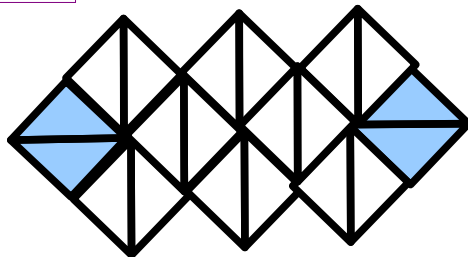
The top ones are knitted in the same direction as the original ones
The bottom ones are knitted in the opposite direction

Where you can, pick up stitches from the original squares instead of casting on

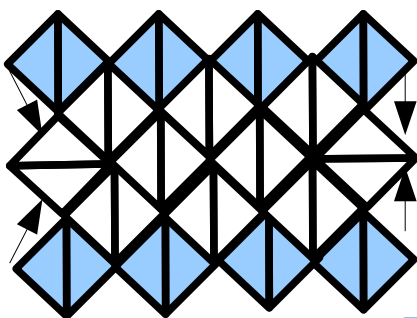
From now on you will only pick up stitches, not cast on



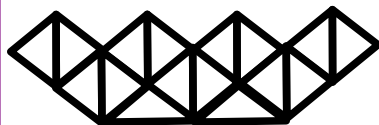
Knit 2 squares shown
Note direction of knitting



Knit 8 squares as shown.
The end squares are each picked up from the edges marked, making the bag 3 dimensional.



Your bag now looks a little like this
Keep adding rows of 8 squares, **with 23 stitch start**, until it is as deep as you like.
At the top finish with triangles.
Add a row of crochet or knitting to make a firm edge if needed.



I used:

4 ply oddments of yarn

2.5mm needles

[I found dp sock needles easy to use]

Knitting beads to embellish

Basic Triangle

Cast on 23 sts [or any odd number]

1st row: Slip 1, K to last st, k1 through back of loop

Decrease row: k2tog, k to centre 3 sts, slip 1, k2tog, psso, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog through back of loop

Repeat these rows until 3 sts remain, k3tog, cast off.

Finishing ideas:

When knitting the last row of squares choose one square at each side to be the strap. Stop decreasing when you reach 11 stitches. Use these stitches to continue as a strap.

Add beads at joining points of squares.

Make a flap by adding more squares on one side.
