

VISIT TO WORKAID

Pat and I were lucky to visit Workaid in Chesham recently.

Workaid is a charity, established in 1986, which recycles tools to support projects in Africa.

Sited in an old boot factory, it is an amazing space, filled with masses of old tools, ranging from woodworking tools, such as hammers and screwdrivers, to crafting tools, such as sewing and knitting machines. Very few donated goods go to waste, as those which cannot be economically shipped overseas are put up for sale in the adjacent charity shop.

We arrived at a busy time, and had to negotiate the car park/yard before passing on one of my old knitting machines, which was gratefully received, as was some fabric and spare containers. As we were talking to one of the volunteers, a bell rang and it was coffee break time! So we went upstairs to share this time with around an estimated forty volunteers, mostly elderly, and our guide, Jason, who then showed us around the upstairs workshop.

This floor held most of the knitting machines, and spare parts for them, as well as an amazing amount of sewing machines, all in various states. We saw the volunteers repairing them, and met the chief knitting machine repairer, a lady, who confessed to a profound interest in machinery, but little interest in knitting with them. She told us that standard gauge machines were most useful, chunky ones less so, because of the climate and the cost of thicker yarn. Along with the machines, accessories kits are sent, to enable recipients to start immediately with their new equipment.

We also saw, on the ground floor, carpentry tools being refurbished, complete with accessories kits, to be shipped to colleges and business start-ups, like the knitting and sewing machines.

Then we saw the containers in the car park. Each container costs thousands to buy and ship. They take a while to be stacked, as every inch of space is used. I thought it looked a bit like building a dry stone wall. The recipients have to collect the items from the port of entry, but that is the only cost to them.

Workaid relies on donations of machines and tools, which are no longer needed. Even broken machines may be of use, as they have to keep large stocks of parts to repair the machines.

I was impressed with the way everything was organised, and the camaraderie of the volunteers. If I lived nearer, who knows, I might feel like volunteering myself, but I am filled with respect for the way this charity works.

In addition, volunteers run workshops in craft, have a look at the website to see what is listed, it all sounds very interesting.


