



PUZZLES

KNITTING CHALLENGE

Use the clues given to help you unlock the code of my message to club members



INSPIRATION, INSTRUCTION AND INFORMATION

TIP:

From Kathy

Mount your Hague Linker on a Lazy Susan e.g <u>SNUDDA from Ikea at £5.50</u>, which will enable you to turn your work and the Linker easily.

PATTERN

TULIP

[named thus, because it is partly TUck and partly sLIP]

A scarf with a slit. Knitted in Superwash 4 ply, standard gauge, in tuck and slip stitch, using Brother card 2, or Knitmaster card 3.

First side

Cast on L36 R36 in waste yarn at T8, and knit a few rows. RC000

Change to main yarn, knit one row reading card, then set machine to slip.

Knit to row 110. Knit the slit. Set carriage to hold. Put needles left of 0 to holding position.

Knit 20 rows. Break yarn.

Put needles on right of 0 to hold. Move carriage to left hand side.

Bring needles left of 0 back into work and knit 20 rows. Cancel hold.

Knit 10 rows. Cancel slip stitch.

Now rearrange the stitches over L48 to R47. To do this, you need to organise them in groups of three, leaving one needle out of work in between the groups. I did this by moving the groups outward gradually, spacing them as I went.

Needle arrangement

L48 R47

Then knit one row to read the punchcard. Set machine to tuck.

Knit 90 rows. Cast off as follows

Put all needles into holding position apart from the group of 3 nearest the carriage. Set carriage to hold.

*Knit 6 rows on these three stitches.

Cast off the end three stitches.

Bring 3 more stitches into work *

Repeat from * to *

Second Side

Now hang the open cast on edge back on the needles. L36/R36

Repeat as for first side, without the slit.

Sew in ends, steam and press. I got some curl on the edges, so I used my Hague linker to stitch up the sides, which reduced it a bit: or you could e-wrap the edge stitches as you go with spare yarn. Or just go with the curl!
