She also brought her shop:








Who knew you could make knitting yarn on the overlocker?





And using a cording foot makes light work of embellishing knitwear using that yarn or others. And much more - mind boggling!

Romeo soluble for embroidery


Cording foot - single or multiple

Appliqué- make a patch - use freezer paper as template iron on. Stitch round on to interfacing.

Leave slit in middle and turn inside out then press.

Blind hem stitch to sew

Overlocking with 4.5 cm stitch length can transfer straight on to knitting machine.


