Welcome to our June meeting

The theme is lace, which includes transfer lace, punch lace and tuck lace. We intend to demonstrate on various machines.

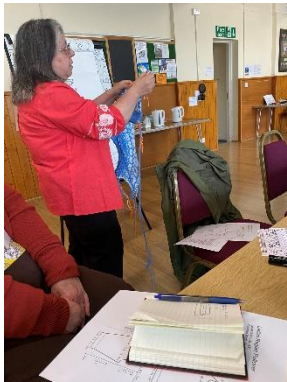

The main part of the meeting is about lace.

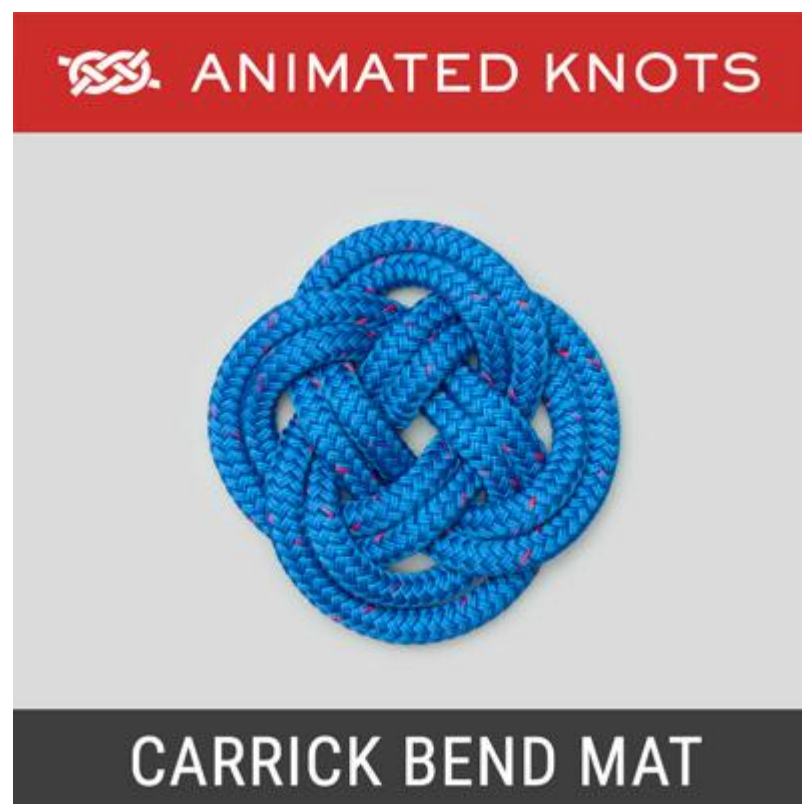
We will attempt to demonstrate:

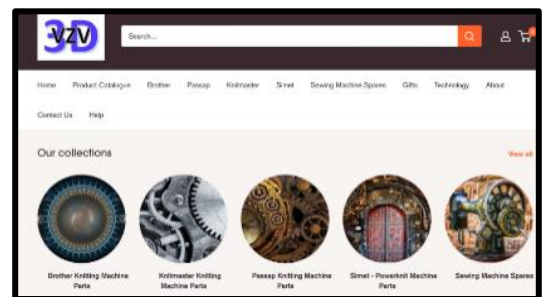
